ABOUT THE COMPANY

The Bronx Opera Company (BxO), now in its 58th season, enjoys a distinguished reputation as a developer of outstanding professional operatic artists who come to New York from all parts of the United States and abroad. With support from various private, business, and governmental sources, carefully rehearsed full productions are presented in The Bronx. All productions are sung in English, with full orchestra and chorus. Repertoire has included well-known works such as *Carmen*, *La bohème*, and *The Magic Flute*, as well as important American or New York premieres of operas such as Smetana's *The Secret*, Vaughan Williams' *Hugh the Drover*, and Rossini's *L'equivoco stravagante*. We were proud to add our 2010 production of the Weber/Mahler *Die drei Pintos* (a New York staged premiere) to this list, as well 2014's East Coast premiere of Kirke Mechem's *The Rivals*.

In addition to full productions, we present concerts throughout the year in The Bronx and surrounding areas from Long Island to Sullivan County. We also have an active program in Bronx schools that promotes a greater understanding of opera among students from elementary grades through high school. Our aim is to introduce opera to those who are unfamiliar with it, to provide a meaningful opportunity for outstanding performers to further their promising careers, and to proudly represent the quality of life in our community. BxO's Teaching Artists are also placed throughout the Bronx in various Community Centers, Senior Centers, and Schools, where they use their knowledge to improve the lives of people across our borough.

This production of *Così fan tutte* is made possible with the invaluable production and rehearsal support of Amalgamated Housing Corporation and Lehman Stages, each of which played host to important rehearsals. This production would have been impossible to create without their help.

BxO adheres to the code of ethics jointly agreed upon by the American Guild of Musical Artists and the Council for Independent Opera Companies of the Tri-State area. Bronx Opera is also part of the New York Opera Alliance, a consortium of small and mid-sized opera producers within the five boroughs. BxO wishes to acknowledge that we live and work on land which is the traditional territory of the Munsee Lenape, Wappinger, and Schaghticoke nations, who were violently displaced as a result of European settler colonialism over the course of 400 years.

ABOUT THE OPERA

Mozart completed Così fan tutte, ossia la scuola degli amanti (All Women Behave Like That, or The School for Lovers) in early winter 1789-1790. This opera, assigned the number 588 in Ludwig von Köchel's catalog of Mozart's works, marked the last of the composer's collaborations with Lorenzo da Ponte (1749-1838), the Italian adventurer and poet who was also the librettist for Le nozze di Figaro (1786) and Don Giovanni (1787). Così was commissioned by Emperor Joseph II in the autumn of 1789, and was apparently complete by December 29th, when Mozart invited his friends Joseph Haydn and Michael Puchberg to hear it in "a little opera rehearsal." The premiere took place a month later, on January 30, 1790. The opera's subsequent life is a fascinating history in itself, with many adaptations of the story (including one to Love's Labour's Lost) and numerous changes in title made by producers who thought its original plot was too frivolous. Many prominent musicians, including Beethoven and Wagner, agreed. Thus, Così received relatively few performances in its original form in the nineteenth century. Its American premiere did not take place until the Metropolitan Opera mounted it on March 24, 1922. Nowadays, the opera has long become established as one of the finest creations from the end of Mozart's tragically short life. "This opera is iridescent, like a glorious soap bubble, with the colors of buffoonery, parody, and both genuine and simulated emotion," observed Mozart biographer Alfred Einstein. He added, "To this, moreover, is added the color of pure beauty...There is an evening glow over the whole score."

Così was the first opera mounted by Bronx Opera, with its initial performance taking place on Friday, November 24, 1967 at Vladeck Hall in The Bronx (where many rehearsals for this production took place). The opera received subsequent BxO productions in 1976, 1986, 1993, and 2006. The present production updates the action from eighteenth century Naples to the New York City area, in 1966.

ABOUT THIS PRODUCTION

The plot of *Così* centers around Alfonso (reimagined as a civilian professor at an unnamed military academy), his cadet students (Ferrando and Guglielmo), their sweethearts (sisters Dorabella and Fiordiligi), and Despina, the sisters' "Gal Friday". Tired of Ferrando and Guglielmo's oft-expressed certainty that their sweethearts are perfect, Alfonso bets them that he can prove that the women (like all of us) are human beings who can, and will fall. The men take the bet, pretend to leave for "war", return wearing (what I hope are good) disguises, and set out to woo each other's sweetheart. Encouraged by Despina (who is working with Alfonso behind the scenes), the sisters decide to give in, leading to confusion and heartbreak as the opera concludes.

As mentioned in my father's essay, the title of *Così* specifically cites the behavior of women. As I have grown older, I increasingly see the plot as being about all of us fallible mortals. I think that the subtitle (The School for Lovers) is really a more accurate depiction of what Così is all about. The school, convened by Mozart and da Ponte, teaches that we are all imperfect, especially when it comes to relationships. This opera brilliantly depicts the interplay of profound friendship and love with the human capability to betray those we care for most. Ferrando and Guglielmo try to seduce each other's partners; their relative success changes their friendship. Fiordiligi and Dorabella try to flirt with the disguised men, hoping to keep their emotions in check. Ultimately, none of the four come out unscathed. The end of the story, as written, sees the couples fully reconcile, recommitting unreservedly to their original partners. However, many productions have interpreted the ending differently, making the case that it's unrealistic for these couples to just go on with their lives after experiencing the trauma set in motion by Alfonso's bet. Bronx Opera's 2025 version is no exception to this trend: the story starts as a farce, but it doesn't end that way. Mozart's work always asks profound questions of us and, often, there are no simple answers. The plot of this piece has, over time, been frequently portrayed with an ambiguity that reflects a deeper truth about humanity ... and, in the end, this is the quality I love most about Così fan tutte (or, as it truly should be retitled, Così fan TUTTI).


